We can all be grateful that MAX IV is a challenger and that such determination has been shown over the years. It shows that the right conditions can be found in Sweden for a project of this magnitude.

It is often these rebels who achieve the best results, because they think outside the box and have the courage to explore uncharted territory.

Even though it has caused some headaches for us Vice-Chancellors and other financiers, we would like to thank MAX IV – all of you who are involved – for being a rebel who shines so brightly!

It is an honour to be Vice-Chancellor of the host university for this facility. I am sure that the rebel, challenger and innovator, MAX IV, will provide us, and the world, with more astonishing results than we could ever have imagined!
